Town and Country- Pagliai's is the location of the April 9<sup>th</sup> meeting and lunch beginning at 11am.




# Calloway County Shines at Homemaker Area Cultural Arts Event

We are so proud of everyone who participated and showcased their creativity. Best of luck to those competing at the state level!






## Yard Sale and Bazaar
