Recipes

Mardi Gras

Have you ever wondered about the difference between Cajun and creole food? Since Mardi Gras Day is February 13th this year, why not try out some new recipes for you and your family? Both seasoning mixes hail from Louisiana. Creole is a mixture of African, Italian, French, Portuguese, and Spanish cooking styles, usually incorporates tomatoes and is considered more refined than Cajun. Cajun seasonings come from Native American, West African, Caribbean and French cooking styles and have a spicy, earthy, and sometimes smoky flavor. Usually, Cajun dishes are brown and tomato-free.

Mardi Gras Day, also known as Fat Tuesday, is a vibrant and festive celebration that marks the culmination of the Carnival season, leading up to the Christian observance of Lent. Fat Tuesday is known for the displays of purple, green and gold and later was given meanings: purple for justice, gold for power and green for faith. These colors are used in all decorations and on the King cake, which is a pastry where a small baby is hidden inside the cake. The baby is to symbolize baby Jesus and whoever finds it is said to have luck and prosperity. If you want to try some gumbo or jambalaya, here are some spice mixes for you.



Creole Spice Mix

½ cup brown sugar
2 tablespoons ground cumin
1 tablespoon granulated garlic
1 tablespoon onion powder
1 tablespoon dried oregano
1 tablespoon thyme leaves
1 tablespoon chili powder
1 tablespoon ground paprika
2 teaspoons ground celery seed
2 teaspoons cayenne pepper
1 tablespoon ground black pepper

Cajun Spice Mix

2 1/2 teaspoons paprika 2 teaspoons salt 2 teaspoons garlic powder 1 1/4 teaspoon dried oregano 1 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme 1 teaspoon black pepper 1 teaspoon onion powder 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional)



For both: Mix and store in an airtight container

On Super Bowl Sunday, February 11, our homemakers club will be hosting our very own Soup-er Bowl Sew Day. Here are the details:


Time: 10 am to 5 pm **Place**: Meeting Hall @ Calloway County Extension


